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What is a Wyoming registered apprenticeship?

There are numerous apprenticeship programs which assist Wyoming in meeting our need for a skilled workforce. Apprenticeships are a unique flexible training program which utilizes job related technical training and on-the-job learning experiences to produce a tailored workforce for employers. Apprenticeships enable trainees to gain a license or certificate to practice in their craft. Training is done while combining hands on experience with an employer with aligned classroom instruction.

How does apprenticeship benefit your business?

Building and utilizing a RAP has a number of financial and social benefits for your business. RAPs recruit and develop a highly skilled workforce, increase business productivity, and reduce employee turnover with an average of 94% of apprentices continuing employment after completing an apprenticeship.

What are the major components of a registered apprenticeship?

A registered apprenticeship, or RAP, is made up of five key components. It must be industry led, include structured on-the-job training, related classroom instruction, a wage progression, and lead to an industry or nationally recognized credential upon completion.
