Learning Tasks (Procedures)

5 min	Motivation/Anticipatory Set : Pep Talk: Today's Goal is to type a rough draft of an Observational Report based on your observation notes. Let yourself write it wrong in order to get something down! We will revise your report in Lesson 5. Play inspirational music like "Eye of the Tiger" or "We are the Champions" to pump up their confidence!	
3 min	Transition:	
3 11111	 Move students to computers Hand out Observational Report Template (attached) 	
10 min	 Activity 1: Go over Observational Report Template Remind students to look at the sample Social Worker's Report Remind students to refer to their observational notes REMIND STUDENTS THAT THIS IS ONLY A ROUGH DRAFT! IT DOES NOT NEED TO BE PERFECT TODAY! Answer questions 	
1 min	Transition: Time to compose! Assist students with computers and template	1
30 min or more	Activity 2: Writing time. Teacher assists students! Print rough draft when finished (or time is up) Save rough draft to USB	1,2,3
5 min	End with Reflection: Tell students to applaud themselves for working so hard! End with another music selection like "I Will Survive"	

Demonstration of Mastery: How will I know that I have met my objectives? What will students DO to show thy have met the objectives?

- o Students will use a computer.
- Students will type a rough draft of an Observational Report.
- o Students will print off a copy of their work.
- o Students will save their rough draft to a USB drive or email it to themselves.

Trouble shooting: Some students may

- not bring written observational notes to class. Have them go view a video of a preschool child and take notes on an observational form while others do the class activity
- not want to type on a computer. Tell them this is an important college and work skill!
- not be able to save on a USB. Show them how or have them email the draft to themselves.

- 1. Get into Word
- 2. Set the font for Times New Roman or Arial
- 3. Set the type size to 12
- 4. Set the draft to double space
